#### "Let me tell you my story..."

**Instructor:** Zoe Fisk

**Dates:** July 19-23

**Ages:** 10-16

**Time:** 9-2:30

**Price:** \$165 (includes 15 dollar supply fee)

Students will become illustrated authors in a week. Participants will bring to life their favorite stories: The time they climbed the tallest tree, the time dad made wooden swords and jousted, how they lost their first tooth. Any kind of story. Students will learn the basics in storytelling, illustration, storyboarding, and book binding, and will bring them to life.

- Storytelling - how to tell a story
- Writing
- Cartooning/Illustration
- Book binding
- Finished book at the end of the week

Students should come to the first day of class with a story. (fictional or real life)

Option: An idea for a story, a character, a plot, etc.

Day 1: We tell our stories, read them, discuss them. General learning of names and such.

Special guest, Karen Fisk, will give a talk about telling a story, then we discuss storyboarding and begin storyboarding. Brainstorming on stories.

Day 2: We make our storyboards, and identify how we want our stories to be illustrated, be it cartoon format, or page by page illustration. We cut our pages out for our books.

Day 3: Illustration Day!

Day 4: Continuation of Illustration Day! Inking in and finishing the pages. Start on making covers for books, and talk about binding, and ways to do so.

Day 5: Finish Books, bind them, and put finishing touches on them.
